Chapter 1 Introduction

1.1 Overview

Cooperated with Mobile DVR, DS-MP1302 LCD Mobile Monitor is able to present the real-time live view of the rear-view camera when the vehicle is backing off and other connected camera. The screen is touchable. You can view and switch the video from the mobile DVR, rear-view camera and other camera on the screen of the monitor. Parameters such as brightness, rear-view mirror, screen closing time, language, etc. can be configured. And you can set parameters of mobile DVR on it. Featured in anti-vibration and anti-interference, the monitor adapts to various mobile environments, and can be applied in bus, coach, securicar, taxi, etc..

1.2 Panel Introduction

DS-MP1302 LCD Mobile Monitor connects to mobile DVR with one 2*7 plug. The pin definitions are the same with Mobile DVR's EXT.DEV interface. See Figure 2.1 and Table 2.1 for the detailed definition.

Chapter 4 Basic Configuration

You can view and switch the video from the mobile DVR, rear-view camera and other camera on the screen of the monitor. Parameters such as brightness, rear-view mirror, power saving time, language, etc. can be configured.

4.1 Displaying and Switching Video on the Screen

4.1.1 Displaying Video on the Screen

Purpose:

By default, the video from the connected mobile DVR is displayed on the screen of the monitor when it is started up.

Steps:

- 1. Connect the mobile DVR and cameras with the LCD mobile monitor.
- 2. Power on the mobile DVR to provide power for the monitor.
- When the monitor is started up, the video input from the connected mobile DVR will be displayed on the screen.

4.1.2 Switching Video on the Screen

Purpose:

The video from the connected mobile DVR, rear-view camera and other camera can be switched on the screen of the monitor. Auto switching and manual switching are supported.

Auto Switching

High level trigger is supported for the monitor. When high level triggers the rear-view camera or other camera, the corresponding video from the triggered camera will be switched to the screen automatically.



If multiple signals are triggered at the same time, the monitor will display video from the rear-view camera first.

Manual Switching

Press **M** button on the monitor to switch the video input display. The displaying sequence is mobile DVR camera>rear-view camera>other camera>mobile DVR camera.

4.2 Configuring Parameters

4.2.3 Configuring Display Channel

Purpose:

By default, the video from the connected mobile DVR is displayed on the screen of the monitor when it is started up. You can change the display channel of the monitor.

Steps:

- 1. Long press **M** button to enter the menu configuration interface.
- 2. Press \blacktriangle or \checkmark button to move the cursor to the **Display Channel** column.
- 3. Press **OK** button to select the **Display Channel** column.
- Press ▲ or ▼ button to select the display channel from the Main Camera, Rear-view Camera and Other Camera.
- 5. Press **OK** button to save the settings.
- 6. Long press **M** button to exit from the current interface.
- 7. Reboot the monitor to take the settings into effect.

4.2.4 Adjusting Screen Brightness

Purpose:

The screen brightness can be adjusted automatically or manually.



If the screen brightness has been adjusted automatically, you cannot adjust it manually unless you disable the auto mode. Or if you have adjusted it manually, you cannot enable the auto mode.

Auto Adjusting

Steps:

- 1. Long press **M** button to enter the menu configuration interface.
- 2. Press \blacktriangle or \checkmark button to move the cursor to the **Auto** column.
- 3. Press **OK** button to select the **Auto** mode and the screen will adjust the brightness automatically.
- 4. Long press **M** button to exit from the current interface.

Manual Adjusting

Steps:

- 1. Long press **M** button to enter the menu configuration interface.
- 2. Press \blacktriangle or \checkmark button to move the cursor to the **Brightness** column.
- 3. Press **OK** button to select the **Brightness** column.
- 4. Press \blacktriangle or \blacktriangledown button to select the brightness value.
- 5. Press **OK** button to save the settings.
- 6. Long press **M** button to exit from the current interface.

4.2.5 Configuring Rear-View Mirror

Purpose:

You can enable the rear-view mirror to display the video from the rear-view camera in left-right mirror mode. *Steps*:

- 1. Long press M button to enter the menu configuration interface.
- 2. Press \blacktriangle or \checkmark button to move the cursor to the **Rear-view Mirror** column.
- 3. Press **OK** button to select the **Rear-view Mirror** column.
- 4. Press \blacktriangle or \checkmark button to enable or disable rear-view mirror function.
- 5. Press **OK** button to save the settings.
- 6. Long press **M** button to exit from the current interface.

4.2.6 Configuring the Screen Closing Time

Purpose:

You can configure the screen closing time to save power.

Steps:

- 1. Long press M button to enter the menu configuration interface.
- 2. Press \blacktriangle or \checkmark button to move the cursor to the **Close Screen** column.
- 3. Press **OK** button to select the **Close Screen** column.
- 4. Press \blacktriangle or \checkmark button to select the screen closing time (10s, 30s, 60s) or never.
- 5. Press **OK** button to save the settings.
- 6. Long press **M** button to exit from the current interface.

4.2.7 Configuring Language

Purpose:

You can configure the language of the monitor.

Steps:

- 1. Long press M button to enter the menu configuration interface.
- 2. Press \blacktriangle or \checkmark button to move the cursor to the Language column.
- 3. Press **OK** button to select the **Language** column.
- 4. Press \blacktriangle or \checkmark button to select the language you want to configure.
- 5. Press **OK** button to save the settings.
- 6. Long press **M** button to exit from the current interface.
